APPLICATION FOR TUITION REMISSION GRANTS

PROCEDURES

The School of Law awards partial tuition remission grants to incoming LL.M. students based on outstanding academic credentials, exceptional career achievements and need. The grant is equally divided between the fall and spring semester of the academic year in which the student is enrolled in the LL.M. Program. Funds are applied toward the student's tuition costs; fees a□ this form and providing comprehensive financial information during the application process.

Applicants for financial assistance are considered within several weeks of admission to the LL.M. Program. In addition to partial tuition remission grants administered by the School of Law, students can find other financial resources to enable them to participate in the LL.M. Program. The School of Law maintains a list of potential external sources of aid, including aid available to international students. Additionally, students should explore loan and assistance programs in their home countries and through international organizations.

ELIGIBILITY

Tuition Remission Grants are limited and applications far exceed the budgeted allotment. Grants awarded to students are determined by thorough documentation of financial need, fund availability, the number of eligible applications received by the application deadline (April 1, 2007), and other financial resources that the student will have access to for funding his/her education. Applicants that receive a grant from the School of Law do so under the condition that he/she informs the School of Law if any other financial source is received. The School of Law reserves the right to adjust the grant because of undisclosed information.
